**AUCTION II – REGULAR FLOOR BID AUCTION.** Everyone is urged to enter at least three lots. Additional lots may be entered at the discretion of the auctioneer. Time constraints limit floor lots to not more than 150. Opening bid will be \$3.00 or the sellers stated minimum selling price. Bidding increments will be announced by the auctioneer. **Minimum price, if any, must be stated on the lot card.**

## MEET THE SPEAKERS 2025

**Larry Crain – Medford, OR:** I collect one country from each continent: US, Colombia, Tannu Tuva, New Zealand, Iceland, and Mozambique Company. Thematically I collect New World archaeology, astronomy, geysers, stamp shapes, etc. I exhibit in local and national shows: mostly vermeils and silver-bronzes. I like doing fun, sometimes outside-the-box exhibits, such as: Around the World in 80 Covers, Are We There Yet?, E for Effort, Rate Change Confusion, February 29, Easter Island, US Post Offices Named El Dorado, Math Quiz, Mystery History Covers, and others to come. I am a member of APS, AAPE, ATA, Copaphil and Southern Oregon Philatelic Society. I am currently editor of the newsletter for the American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors, president of the Northern California Council of Philatelic Societies, past-president of SOPS, and co-editor of Codex Filatelica (of the now defunct Meso-American Study Unit). I have given presentations in Oregon, California, Nevada, Washington, and Iowa – usually on something having to do with “fun collecting.”

**Kristin Patterson – San Jose, CA:** My collecting interest started at the age of 10 when I began trading playing cards on the grade school playground in a suburb of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The goal was to acquire playing cards with as many different back designs as possible. About the time my playing card collection reached 800 cards, I discovered that U.S. postage stamps could be collected. Stamp collecting has been an on-and-off hobby since age of 13. In 1998, these two collecting hobbies merged when I discovered that the U.S. Government had issued revenue stamps as a means to cover the tax on playing cards. I have multiple playing cards stamps exhibits. In 2024, my first 10-frame exhibit entitled, *United States Playing Cards Tax Stamps and Uses (1894-1965)* won a Gold Award at ChicagoPex. I have written philatelic articles and given many presentations.

**Vera Felts -- Sequim, Wash.:** I am a general collector of stamps of the U.S., Canada, Scandinavia and Thailand. And a topical collector of myriad themes. I concentrate primarily on collecting Gastronomy related items but that crosses over into textile handwork, diseases and body parts, UNESCO world heritage, "Veras" on stamps and many other topics too numerous to mention. Originally from rural Illinois, from 2009-2019 I was Executive Director of the American Topical Association (ATA). Prior to that, I did extensive volunteer work for such organizations as the American Philatelic Society, Washington 2006, and the St. Louis Stamp Expo. My "home" local stamp clubs have been the Southern Illinois Stamp Club (15-year newsletter editor) and the Strait Stamp Society. I was selected by *Linn's Stamp News* as one of the 100 Most Influential Philatelists. Known everywhere as the "gingerbread lady" for spearheading holiday fundraisers, and I also have followed in Anne Harris' shoes by keeping Arn Symposium participants well supplied with cookies.

**Joe Voice – Pasco, WA:** I started collecting and researching stamps about 1996. I soon extended my interest into postal history – in particular, researching Varney Air Lines and collecting associated material from Contract Air Mail routes 5 and 32. After listening to a clothesline presentation on the Varney Airgram given by Howard Ness here at Moses Lake years ago I expanded my Varney Air Lines research and collecting into these. That research resulted in my generation of a design type catalog of the Varney Airgram presented in a three-frame competitive exhibit I've shown at the Willamette Valley Exhibition, PIPEX and SEAPEX. I'm in the process of consolidating the results of my research in these areas into a book entitled *Walter T. Varney, Varney Air Lines and the Varney Airgram*. My other current collecting interests include Greenland postal history, AMG Germany, covers from the 2-cent US Airmail rate period and local bicycle post issues/covers. I continue to enjoy research much more than collecting, leading into philatelic exhibiting starting in 2021. I've written technical articles that have been published in the journal of the Allied Military Government Collectors Club. My research for a US Navy patrol aircraft exhibit produced information correcting and expanding upon previous published information. This new information is being incorporated into the latest revision of the Trans-Oceanic Record Flights section of the American Air Mail Catalogue currently in preparation by the American Air Mail Society.
